with SUW Partner Agencies



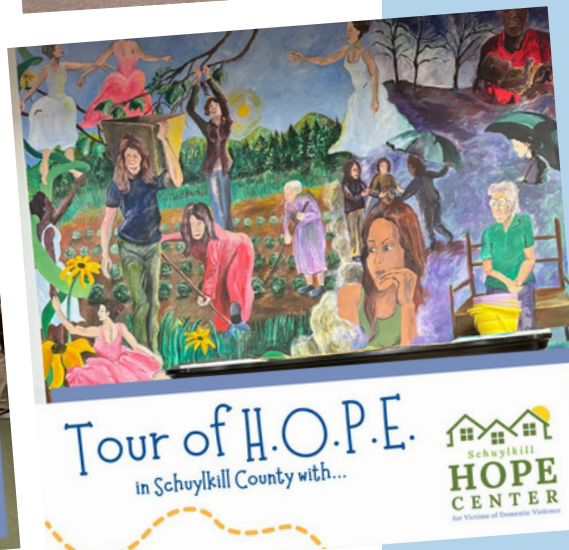
Throughout 2024, SUW staff and members of the Board of Directors embarked on a **Tour of H.O.P.E.** to visit our Partner Agencies.

# Year One of HIVE

Community ideas & action.

HIVE is a response to the data, conversations, and ideas shared during the **SUW Meet ALICE** event in September 2023. The 2023 ALICE in PA report indicated that while 12% of Schuylkill Countians are living at or under the Federal Poverty Line, another 28% are **Asset Limited, Income Constrained Employed** (ALICE = **working & unable** to make ends meet).

40% of our county is extremely vulnerable and at the mercy of our community assistance programs and resources. We must work together. Special thanks to **Dollar General** and **UGI** for doing special collections in 2024 to support our school nurses through our Nurse's Pantry!

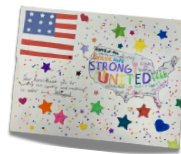


## SUW CAPT. JASON B. JONES MEMORIAL DAY OF CARING

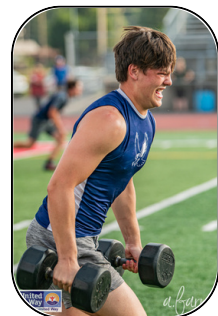


## HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL CHALLENGE

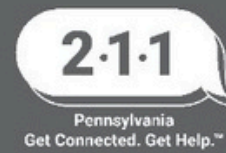

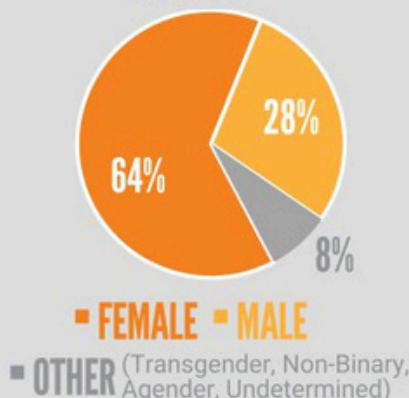
## TOP UNMET NEEDS\*

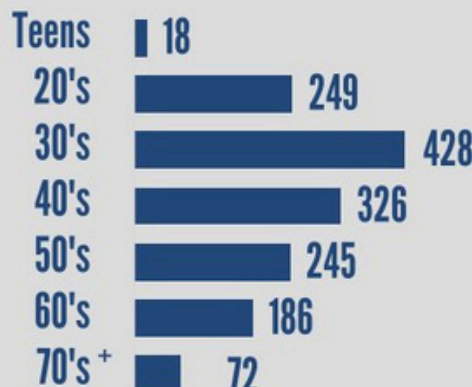
