Mother Nature was again unkind to us in 2025 for our annual Day of Caring causing many postponements and a couple cancelation of projects. Nevertheless, 485 volunteers completed 20 projects across the county, and we say **thank you!**

Over 800 letters were collected from schools, libraries, nursing homes, and youth groups for **Operation Gratitude!**

Blue Mountain Elementary West 4th grade students continued the tradition of placing flags on the graves of veterans with members of the local Legion. Their **5th grade class** performed for veterans at the VA in Lebanon County. Special thanks to Susie Jones for always speaking with the students about the bravery & community committment of her son, Capt. Jason Jones.



In 2020, SUW launched the Nurse's Pantry to **provide school nurses essential items** to help students stay healthy, stay focused, and stay in school.

Underwear, socks, deodorant, toothbrushes & toothpaste, lice kits and school approved clothing are items that can be found in SUW Nurse's Pantries. They are available to each elementary, middle, and high school in Schuylkill County.



SUW provided \$8,500 for clothing & hygiene supplies in 2025, with an additional \$5,500 for lice kits.

In addition, SUW continued its **See to Succeed** program that allows school nurses to give students a voucher for Eyeland Optical in Pottsville if the nurse believes the student needs a comprehensive eye exam & glasses. Thanks to our generous donors, SUW is able to cover the cost for these services.

Year Two of HIVE

Community ideas & action.

HIVE is a response to the data, conversations, and ideas shared during the SUW Meet **ALICE** event in September 2023. The 2023 ALICE in PA report indicated that while 12% of Schuylkill Countians are living at or under the Federal Poverty Line, another 28% are Asset Limited, Income Constrained **Employed** (ALICE = **working & unable** to make ends meet).

The **most recent ALICE data**, released in May 2025, shows a slight decrease to 27% of Schuylkill Countians are now ALICE. However, those at or below the Federal Poverty Line (FPL) increased to 15%. This tell us 42% of our community members are vulnerable and in need.

Bonus HIVE Events & Results


HIVE Housing Collaborative: Spearheaded by Schuylkill Community Action with the goal of gathering various interested groups for solutions to safe, affordable housing.

PA211 & PA Navigate Workshops: In November, Schuylkill County HIVE organized virtual, hands-on workshops to teach attendees how to use PA 211 and PA Navigate. These offerings also explained how organizations can ensure their program details were listed and kept up to date on both systems. Sessions were recorded and given out as tools for future reference.

HIVE Transportation Task Force: This group is looking at ways to promote public transportation and enhance other non-vehicle options like biking and walking, connecting people to places and essential services.

Immediate Past Board President, Mr. John Gleisner explained at the breakfast,

“In 1936, in the middle of the Great Depression, community leaders in Schuylkill County realized that many people in our community were suffering..they got together with the leaders of 15 social service agencies, and had a fund drive.”

Gleisner went on to say this was the start of Schuylkill United Way in the county and that five of those original social service agencies are still Partner Agencies with SUW. They include: The Schuylkill County Society for Pediatric Orthopedics, American Red Cross in Schuylkill County, Salvation Army Pottsville Corps, Scouting America Hawk Mountain Council, and the Schuylkill YMCA.

With the official launch of our 2026 Campaign at the annual Kick Off Breakfast held on Friday, September 5, 2025, we also held the initial celebration of our 90th Anniversary!
